### **President's Letter**

I'm writing this letter at the end of August 2021. After 18 months of virtual learning, hybrid learning, quarantines, COVID-testing and exposure scares, the kids are finally back in school! Many are starting to return to the office for work in sporadic fits and starts. It is in this climate of cautiousness and uncertainty that we release our second annual report.

A community foundation is a grantmaking organization. In 2020, we were blessed with over \$400,000 in donations from community members to actively respond to COVID-19 pandemic. The COVID-19 Response Fund was fully distributed to local nonprofits, hospitals and small businesses between April and November 2020. During the 2020-2021 fiscal year, our tireless grants committee reviewed 53 applications and awarded \$213,300 grants to 41 area nonprofits. In Spring 2021, we ran our first round of the San Carlos Community Grant Program funded by endowment returns and contributions from community members, the City of San Carlos and Alexandria Real Estate Enterprises.

For the second year in a row, I am blown away by what our community and volunteers have come together to accomplish. Spurred to action by the racially charged events during the summer of 2020, the Community Foundation of San Carlos formed a Racial Justice Committee composed of community volunteers and board members. Supported by a donation of \$10,000 from a local community member, this group of volunteers have realized diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) efforts that have touched so many lives in the brief span of a year.

As we look into 2021-2022, we will continue to focus on the well-being of our community and deepening our focus on the environment across our grantmaking and community building efforts.

The Community Foundation of San Carlos cannot exist without the time, partnership and financial support from caring community members like you. We put our best effort into our work, ensuring that our decisions are well-informed and our programs follow best practices. We are financially accountable for stewardship of community funds.




### **About Us**



The Community Foundation of San Carlos was established in November 2019 with a \$2M endowment from the City of San Carlos. The Foundation was formed to serve all who live, work, learn or play in San Carlos for current and future generations by amplifying the impact of nonprofits serving the community.

The Community Foundation of San Carlos serves as a connector for the community and local organizations by identifying community needs and sharing information resources. The Community Foundation addresses identified community needs by bringing together local nonprofits, businesses, service organizations, community leaders and donors to contribute time, in-kind goods & services and financial resources to create sustainable solutions. The focus of 2021 was on supporting community members impacted by the pandemic while celebrating the rich and diverse heritage that comprise our community.





### Grants Awarded \$213K



The Community Foundation of San Carlos provides community grants to local nonprofits that help families, uplift the vulnerable, and enhance the well-being of all who live, work, learn or play in San Carlos.

Each year the Grants Committee collects input on needs to define grant priorities, along with the constant criteria of impact to the San Carlos community's wellbeing. Nonprofit organizations serving the San Carlos community are welcome to apply each year in the Fall. The grant dollars available yearly shift based upon endowment investment returns and donations from community members. 2020-21 Community Grant focus areas:

- Basic Needs Programs & Services food, housing, mental health, and other core services for low-income and vulnerable community members
- Social Justice & Equity—programs, services, and initiatives that address inequity and/or promote social justice values and norms
- Community Building & Social Connectedness — programs and initiatives that promote positive connections among community members

### **Financial Report**


The year ending June 2021 was the Foundation's first full year of operations. We have continued to manage our funds with the dual goals of supporting our community today and growing our endowment to support our community's needs into the future. We are happy to report significant progress towards both of these goals.

During the year, we received \$266K in contributions. The Foundation made grants to local organizations totaling \$213K which is more than twice our planned level of activity. Our operating expenses of \$11K were well under budget. As a result of operations, we were able to make a contribution of \$148K to the Foundation's endowment to support future growth.


The Foundation's endowment portfolio returned over 22% during the year despite being almost half invested in lower risk fixed income investments. Our endowment was valued just below \$2.5 million at the end of June. The Foundation's Board of Directors decided to set aside a portion of this year's earnings to support the Foundation's operations for the next two years and elected to retain the remaining gains in the endowment to support continued growth.


