Dear Friends,

2020 has been a history-making year beyond all our imaginations! I am so honored to have the privilege of writing this letter in our inaugural annual report. This first year was *supposed* to be a quiet one. Our plan was to focus on listening/learning about our community's needs while the \$2M endowment from the City of San Carlos earns returns to fund the Foundation's inaugural grant cycle in 2021. Well, THAT didn't happen.

Instead of participating at the Volunteer Fair and sponsoring Hometown Days to share our vision and goals as a newly formed Community Foundation, our allvolunteer Board and Committee members spent our first year "walking the talk".

Through an introduction from the San Carlos Chamber of Commerce, we received a generous donation from long-time San Carlos residents, the Holmes Family. With endorsement from the City, we established the San Carlos COVID-19 Response Fund. The fund received over \$400k in donations which were granted to over 30 nonprofit organizations for COVID-related relief.

Our City Council members and City Staff have been amazing partners as we collaborate on community-focused racial justice efforts and bring the community together for mutual support during this unprecedented time through the Neighbors Helping Neighbors program orchestrated by super-volunteer, Sandy Kraft.



FINANCIAL STATEMENT

The Community Foundation operates on a July 1 to June 30 fiscal year.





*Includes grants approved in June and paid in July.

At its core every foundation needs to be a good steward of the funds entrusted to it. We have made every effort to be thoughtful fiduciary of all funds that we manage.

Our investment policy directs us to invest in a well-diversified portfolio of low-cost investments. We have engaged a professional investment advisory firm and our investment committee regularly meets with our advisor and oversees the investment portfolio and performance.

We are happy to report a modest 2% positive return on our endowment despite the downturn in the market during our first fiscal year ended in June. A portion of the investment returns will now be available to make grants in the upcoming year and the remainder will be added to the endowment to support its continued growth.
